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# **INITIATION OF THE MEETING**

Item No. 1: Welcome address by the Chairperson of the Senate: Prof. Manoj Kumar Dhar, Chairperson, Senate, AcSIR extended a warm welcome to all the Senate members and informed that he has recently assumed charge as the Director, AcSIR and that he shall look forward to active support of all members of the Senate in order to achieve excellence in all spheres of working of AcSIR.

Item No. 2: Confirmation of the Proceedings of the 29<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Senate: The proceedings of the 29<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Senate, held on May 11, 2022, were communicated to the members by email. As there were no comments or suggestions from the senate members, the minutes of the 29<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Senate stand confirmed.

Item No. 3: Action Taken Report (ATR) on the 29<sup>th</sup> Meeting of the Senate: The Senate members were updated about the actions taken with respect to the decisions of the 29<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Senate. Members were also updated about the extent of completion / progress of tasks in this regard. Only those items, where action is still in process, are mentioned below, with their current status:

- (i) Introduction of Faculty of Study in Pharmaceutical Sciences: The Senate was apprised that no major progress could be achieved towards completion of the activity. To take the matter forward, Prof. Saman Habib was requested by the Chairperson to prepare a concept note providing the details on the need for starting the new Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences along with details of the interested Institutes having ongoing research in the area, tentative faculty and student participation, course work etc. and also to look into the necessity of regulatory clearance from Pharmacy Council of India. The matter would be taken up further on receipt of the detailed proposal.
- (ii) Introduction of Faculty of Agricultural Sciences: The Senate was informed that necessary OM was issued on October 27, 2022 and the Institutes, desirous of enrolling Ph.D students under the Faculty of Agricultural Sciences, were requested to provide Ph.D level courses and identify the potential teaching faculty before the enrollment of students under the Faculty of Agricultural Sciences could be initiated. The Senate was informed that despite three reminders, none of the Institutes responded to the call. The Chairperson, Senate desired that this process must be taken forward with the concerned Directors of the Institutes where the ongoing research is in areas covered under Agricultural Sciences.

The Senate took note of the status of all the actions taken, with reference to the decisions taken during the 29<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Senate.

Item No. 30: Academic affiliation of non-CSIR Institutes with AcSIR through Agreements and Extension of Agreement with Public Health Foundation of India: The Senate considered the matter of academic affiliation and resolved to accept the affiliation requests from (i) Centre for Nano & Soft Matter Sciences (CeNS), Bengaluru; (ii) TCG Centres for Research and Education in Science and Technology (TCG CREST), Kolkata; and (iii) in-principle approval for Indian Institute of Astrophysics (IIA), Bengaluru (subject to favourable recommendations of the Committee), as Associate Academic Centres of AcSIR and extension of the Agreement with PHFI for another term of 10 years on the expiry of the initial agreement signed on April 05, 2013. The terms and conditions of the Agreement may be re-visited for improvement, wherever applicable.

Emanating out of the discussion, the Senate resolved introduction of a one-time application fee and a yearly continuity fee from Institutes/ Trusts seeking academic affiliation with AcSIR, subject to the approval of the Board of Governors, AcSIR.

Item No. 31: Memorandum of Understanding between AcSIR and University of Turku, Finland for conduct of Joint Doctoral Education and student exchange: The Senate approved the proposed non-binding Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with University of Turku, Finland, for initiation of a Joint Doctoral Education and Student Exchange program in the research areas covered under Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM). The Senate noted that a formal Agreement would follow subsequently for establishment for Joint Doctoral Degree Education and/or for student exchange program.

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Item No. 32: Discontinuation for academic affiliation with Centre for DNA Fingerprinting and Diagnostics (CDFD), Hyderabad: The Senate approved the discontinuation of the Academic Agreement with Centre for DNA Fingerprinting and Diagnostics (CDFD), Hyderabad on mutual consent, which was formalized on February 01, 2019 for 5 years, due to no academic activity taking place under this agreement.

Item No. 33: Revision in the maximum residency period for Ph.D program, as per UGC guidelines: The Senate resolved the adoption of Clause of Clause 4 (1 to 3) of the recently notified UGC (Minimum Standards and Procedures for Award of Ph.D. Degree) Regulations, 2022 that "Ph.D. Program shall be for a minimum duration of three years including coursework, and a maximum duration of six years from the date of admission to the Ph.D. program". Further, "a maximum of additional two years can be given through a process of re-registration, provided, the total period for completion of a Ph.D. program should not exceed eight years from the date of admission in the Ph.D. program".

The Senate further resolved that the period of Academic Break(s) will henceforth be counted while computing the total residency period of a student in the Ph.D program. Further, the Academic Break(s) can only be availed after the successful completion of the Comprehensive Examination and only during the regular residency period of 6 years. Further, the female Ph.D. scholars and Persons with Disabilities (having more than 40% disability) may be allowed an additional relaxation of two years, including the period of maternity leave.

Additionally, students who are unlikely to submit their Ph.D thesis within the maximum residency period of 6 years, will have to seek re-registration in Ph.D at least 01 month before the completion of their 6-year period of residency in the Ph.D program, on payment of re-registration fee.

Item No. 34: Conduct of Viva-voce examination through online mode: The Senate resolved that the viva-voce examinations be conducted through the online/hybrid mode. The external examiner will hold the viva only through online mode. The viva-voce examination be arranged in a hall with at least the physical presence of the student, supervisor(s), DAC members and other scholars and scientists/faculty of the Institute as open defense. However, in exceptional cases, the Ph.D student or the supervisor may request the AcSIR-HQ for appearance through the online mode, with appropriate justification and after prior approval of the Director, AcSIR.

The Senate further resolved to discontinue the "Digital Communication Allowance" (DCA) paid to the external examiners for conduct of viva online with effect from April 01, 2023.

- Item No. 35: External Examiners of Ph.D Thesis Board proposed by the Supervisor(s): The Senate resolved the amendment in the constitution of the Thesis Board for proposing external examiners of the Ph.D thesis, as follows:
- (1) At least 8 external examiners should be proposed in the thesis board, each of whom should be at least of Associate Professor/ Professor or equivalent levels from reputed Institutes/Universities and should be an expert in the core research domain of the Ph.D thesis. Prior consent of the external examiners shall be obtained for evaluating the thesis.
- (2) The proposed external examiners can be selected keeping in mind the following conditions: (i) a maximum of two external examiners from a single state and not more than one external examiner from one institution/university; (ii) CSIR Scientists and AcSIR faculty members from CSIR and AcSIR-affiliated institutes shall not be proposed as external examiners; (iii) collaborators of the research

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supervisor with whom the concerned student has worked or co-authored any publication, shall not be proposed as an external examiner; (iv) the external examiners who have already evaluated 2 AcSIR Ph.D thesis, in the Institute where the thesis is being submitted, in a calendar year, cannot be proposed.

Item No. 36: Revision in the constitution of Ph.D student screening and selection committee for admission: The Senate resolved the revised constitution of the Screening and Selection Committee for admission to the Ph.D program at the Academic Centres for each of the faculty of study, as follows

- (1) Director of the institute or senior most scientist from the Institute (who is also faculty of AcSIR supervising Ph.D students) nominated by the Director of the institute will act as the Chairperson;
- (2) One external expert from relevant field(s)/faculty of study;
- (3) One subject expert from within the institute (if required) nominated by Director of the Institute;
- (4) One representative from any of the reserved categories (SC or ST or OBC);
- (5) Dean or his/her nominee;
- (6) Coordinator of AcSIR at the Institute will act as the Convener;One woman representative, from among the members (1) to (6) above.

For constitution of the Screening Committee, 'one external expert' is to be replaced by 'one senior member of the institute' in the above committee.

Item No. 37: Inter-institutional transfer of Ph.D students after minimum of one semester: The Senate resolved that the inter-institutional transfer of Ph.D students would only be allowed after the completion of minimum of one semester of the student's Ph.D enrollment in the institute, where the student was originally selected for admission. However, under exceptional circumstances (including marriage, transfer of parents/spouse, medical reasons etc), such requests can be considered by the Chairperson, Senate for approval, provided they are accompanied by relevant documentary proof.

Item No. 38: Transfer of course credits: The Senate resolved that more than four course credits of the student can be considered for transfer towards meeting the AcSIR course-credits requirements, depending on the NIRF/QS rankings of the institution, where these course credits have been earned. Based on the course curriculum and its equivalence to that of the AcSIR courses, the Dean of the concerned faculty would recommend the same for the approval of the Associate Director (Academics).

Item No. 39: Conversion from Regular to Sponsored category of Ph.D enrolment: The Senate resolved that students enrolled as regular candidates, who get employment during their Ph.D tenure, may be permitted to convert their Ph.D enrollment from "Regular" to "Sponsored" category, after obtaining NOC from their employer, subject to their meeting all the admission pre-requisites for the sponsored student category and after completion of minimum of one semester residency period on campus for course work. After the transfer of such students from regular to the sponsored category, they would be governed by the existing guidelines applicable to the sponsored students.

However, conversion from Sponsored to Regular category student would not be permitted.

Item No. 40: Eligibility of Ph.D applicants with INSPIRE Ph.D Fellowship: The Senate resolved that the INSPIRE Ph.D fellowship awardees, who do not have a confirmed fellowship, may be considered by all the institutes in the screening and selection process for admission to Ph.D program, at par with CSIR/UGC fellowship awardees, and may be selected provisionally. The selection shall necessarily be

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made on the basis of oral examination which shall be considered equivalent to a written examination. Such students, if not finally selected for the INSPIRE Fellowship, may be given an option to continue in the Ph.D program without a Fellowship, with approval of the Director of the concerned Institute, failing which the provisional admission will stand cancelled.

Item No. 41: Revision of eligibility criteria for "Project Assistants" being considered for admissions to AcSIR Ph.D program: The Senate resolved to accept the revision of the eligibility criteria for "Project Assistants" for admission to AcSIR Ph.D program, in compliance with Clause 4(5)(g, h and i) of the AcSIR Ordinances, 2017 and in partial modification of the AcSIR OM No. AcSIR/8/1(1)-2022 dated 15.03.2022 bearing the subject "Clarifications on the AcSIR Ph.D eligibility criteria for "Project Assistants", as follows:

- (i) Only those exceptionally bright Project Assistants working in the Institutes may be considered for admission to AcSIR Ph.D program who have been in temporary employment as a Project Assistant in a sanctioned R&D project of the same Institute for at least one year (one year will be reckoned on the last date of admission confirmation by payment of fees, as notified by AcSIR in the Academic Session in which the Project Assistant intends to seek admission for Ph.D), and can only apply with the prior permission of the PI of the project and concurrence of the Director of the Institute;
- (ii) The Project Assistants who are being considered for admission to the AcSIR Ph.D program must fulfill the educational qualification as required for the project and the Screening and Selection committee, constituted as per rules of AcSIR, must evaluate the knowledge of the candidate in the subject and research capabilities critically with proper justification;
- (iii) The Project Assistant must have at least one publication in a SCI journal with substantial research contribution and only as a first or second author of the publication;
- (iv) The selection shall necessarily be made on the basis of an oral examination by the Ph.D selection committee constituted at the Institute, which shall be considered equivalent to a written examination;
- (v) The financial assistance from the project to the applicant should be valid for at least one year from the notified date of commencement of the academic session for which the applicant is seeking PhD admission:
- (vi) On completion of their tenure of the R&D project from which the student was drawing his/her fellowship, the student may be given an option to continue in the Ph.D program without a fellowship, with approval of the Director of the concerned Institute, failing which their admission in the Ph.D program will stand cancelled.

Item No. 42: Provision of Ph.D enrollment for all employees of AcSIR-affiliated Institutes: The Senate resolved to defer the proposal and take opinion of the Directors of all concerned Institutes before taking a decision on this matter.

Item No. 43: Nomination of Nodal Officer (Academic Compliance): The Senate approved the nomination of Prof. Raji Reddy, former AcSIR Coordinator at CSIR-IICT, Hyderabad, as the Nodal Officer (Academic Compliance).

Item No. 44: Application of Dr. R.K. Kotnala, former Chief Scientist, CSIR-NPL as AcSIR Emeritus Professor (Honorary): The Senate approved the nomination of Dr. R.K. Kotnala, former Chief Scientist, CSIR-NPL, for recognition as an Emeritus Professor of AcSIR. The Senate further resolved

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that for all such future requests for academic recognition of AcSIR, the academic and research credentials of the concerned scientist and their past contribution to AcSIR must be determined along with consent of the concerned Director of the Institute, to which such faculty wishes to remain affiliated.

### Item No. 45: Any other Item with permission of the Chair:

With approval of the Chairperson, Senate, the following item was discussed:

(i) The Senate decided to defer any decision on eligibility of students to AcSIR Ph.D program after a 4-year/8-semester bachelor's degree program.
